

# 'Eligible persons failed to benefit from plans'

## Chief Minister orders suspension of DIC manager in charge

CHIEF MINISTER Shivraj Singh Chouhan said here on Tuesday that in the absence of information and lack of appropriate action at lower level eligible people failed to get the benefit of the development schemes. He ordered suspension of manager in charge of District Industries Centre (DIC), Bhopal.

Chouhan's observation regarding poor implementation of development schemes came during monthly Samadhan online programme while interacting with divisional commissioners and district collectors.

The CM said adequate number

of claims was not being received in many districts for pattas on forestlands under Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition to Forest Rights) Act.

Similarly, he said, the implementation of schemes for providing subsidy up to Rs 10,000 on diesel-power pump sets to small and marginal farmers and grant of up to Rs 24,000 for tube wells and pumps to the small and marginal farmers as announced in the Kisan Mahapanchayat is not satisfactory.

The CM also directed the authorities to distribute free bicycles to eligible girl students of VI and VIII by August 10, launch 'School Chalen Ham campaign'

for enrolment of children from July 1, distribute text books on time and uniforms by August 15, complete the process of contract school teachers and their appointment by June 30 and ensure action in cases pertaining to boundaries of forest and revenue departments.

He directed the collectors to solve the problems of disabled persons on first and third Mondays every month from 11 am to 12 noon at district headquarters and ensure presence of the superintendents of police at the meetings regarding Goshalas.

He apprised himself of the distribution of wheat through fair price shops on prescribed days, implementation of Anna-

purna Yojana and status of implementation of the various announcements made by him from time to time and to inform of this to the Chief Minister's Secretariat.

The CM expressed displeasure over delay in payment for vehicles engaged for election work in Ratlam district.

On complaint of Jagdish Goswami of village Fatara in Sheopur district whose son died after snakebite, regarding non-payment of Rs 50,000 the collector informed that the naib nazir was suspended in this case and the draft would be sent to the address of the applicant in this case. A panchayat inspector was suspended in Shivpuri district.
